Big November Night At The Alice Springs Desert Park

The Alice Springs Desert Park will celebrate another great year on Friday night when The Friends of the Desert Park holds its annual Big November Night.

Park Manager Gary Fry said the local community would be thanked for its support during the past year with the park open for free between 6:30pm and 9pm.

Mr Fry said this year's highlights included last week's major win at the Brolga Awards, as well as being a finalist in the Weekend Australian's Travel and Tourism Awards in the Family Focused section.

Mr Fry said Yamba the Honeyant would make a special appearance on Friday night where the park's caterers, Wildlife Park Services and operators of Madigans and Wagglers would be selling food.

More than 1500 people attend the annual Big November Night and Mr Fry is hoping this year will be no exception.

"The park is key part of Alice Springs and the local community's support has certainly helped us along to where we are today and my staff and I are thankful for all the support we have received," Mr Fry said.
