**NEW TERRITORY PASSES FOR DESERT PARK.**

Territorians will be allowed unlimited access to the Alice Springs Desert Park with the introduction of a new ticketing policy, Environment Minister Marion Scrymgour has announced.

The Territorian Pass enables 12 month access to the popular Territory park – all for the price of one admission fee.

Ms Scrymgour said the Territorian Pass is a new and exciting way for Territorians to enjoy their natural and cultural heritage – and was also a significant tourism incentive.

“So for just \$20 Territorians can access the Desert Park as many times as they like throughout the year!” Ms Scrymgour said.

“I understand how expensive it can get for Territory families who like to visit the park, or are regularly bringing interstate friends and relatives to the Park.

“With this incentive they can bring their interstate or overseas guests to the park and not have to worry about paying admission for themselves whenever they come back.

“We hope Territorians will continue to support these important tourism operations by bringing along family and friends from outside the Territory so they all may learn about this country, rich in natural and cultural history.

“So if you haven’t been to the Desert park for a while, or even if you have, get your Territorian Passes this weekend that will allow you unlimited access to these parks in the future.”

Territorian Passes will be available to all residents of the Northern Territory upon presentation of appropriate identification.
