

EDUCATION PROGRAM

Essential introduction to Australia's desert

Alice Springs Desert Park is a government-owned, purpose-built facility that brings the Central Australian desert to life. Students will gain an understanding that the country around them is ancient, alive, exciting and dynamic. They'll learn about the connection between desert plants, people, landscapes and culture.

The Desert Park offers guided and self-guided tour programs for local, remote and interstate students in the areas of science, flora and fauna, geography and history— all specific to Central Australia.

School programs provide opportunities for students to connect with desert flora and fauna and Aboriginal culture, build their understandings, and be empowered to take action to help save wildlife.

On a cultural tour, students will learn how it's possible to survive in a desert and hear the survival stories of desert people. They'll walk through the local people's ancient supermarket, hardware shop and pharmacy. It's these experiences that will inspire the students to find answers themselves, presenting the challenge of research skills, creative thinking, personal interpretation and a general understanding of the area.

At night, students can learn about rare and endangered animals of Central Australia on the very popular Nocturnal Tour. Don a head lamp and step into the Mulga Walk, a large predator-proof enclosure to see bilbies, come centimetres from an echidna and, if you're lucky, spot Mala now only found in captivity on the mainland.



A visit to Alice Springs Desert Park will provide students with:

- an understanding that the country around them is ancient, alive, exciting and dynamic
- an awareness of the interconnected lives of desert plants, animals, people and landscapes
- an opportunity to recognise, interact with and reflect on cultural perspectives different to their own
- appreciation that the desert is a special and worth protecting

Experiences

Alice Springs Desert Park provides engaging activities from a self-guided exploration, exclusive tailored one hour-presentations, guided tours or a complete desert experience.

SELF GUIDED

Option available 7.30am to 6pm, seven days a week. Make the most of your day by checking out your favorite presentations:

- 9.15am Largest Marsupial – Red Kangaroo
- 10.00am Nature Theatre – free flying birds
- 11.00am Aboriginal Survival in the Desert – cultural talk
- 12.00pm Desert Animals – Nocturnal House

A complimentary meet and greet with brief introduction to the Desert Park is provided for all school group bookings.

Please note public presentations are subject to change and recommend requesting a current program on booking. Priority is given to the general public. Public presentations are limited to 40-60 people per presentation with exception to Nature Theatre with seating for 230.

DISCOVERY SESSION

Sessions range from 45-60 minutes and the topic can be tailored to the age group of students. Please select one session from the following categories:

Desert Plants

Alternatively if you have a topic in mind, please provide background on the booking for consideration from our team. Discovery sessions are limited to 200 people depending on the topic. Available Monday to Friday between 8.30am and 5pm.

CULTURAL WALK

What is it we humans need to survive? Be met by a Guide on arrival to begin your discovery. Be involved in interactive activities that share knowledge on belonging to and looking after the land, its plants and animals and each other. Walk from Desert Rivers to Sand Country learning about how to find water in the desert and different tracks and tools used by desert Aboriginal people. In the Park's Nocturnal House learn about hunting and sign language before continuing the journey to the Nature Theatre to be enthralled by birds of prey and other predators of the desert. An Aboriginal Guide is not guaranteed, however the Desert Park will endeavour to meet the request.

Inclusions:

- 2.5 hour exclusive guided tour
- Exploration of Aboriginal culture, plants and animals
- Guided tour of Nocturnal House
- Nature Theatre – free flying bird presentation

Departure: Seven days a week departing at 8am, 9.45am, 1.30pm or 3.15pm

Capacity: Minimum of 15 and maximum 75 people.



NOCTURNAL TOUR

Step inside the Mulga Walk enclosure for an evening of adventure and discovery. Spotlight endangered and extinct animals no longer found in Central Australian deserts including mala and bilby in the foothills of the MacDonnell Ranges. Students will learn about endangered species of the desert and how they can make a difference.

Inclusions:

- 1 hour spotlighting tour in the Mulga Walk habitat, an exclusive area not available to the public during the day.
- A chance to see rare and endangered animals.
- Includes head torch for every person.
- Cameras are welcome but no flash photography please.
- Wear sturdy walking shoes; bring water, insect repellent (optional) and warm clothes in winter.

Departure: Winter (1 April to 30 September) 7pm
Summer (1 October to 31 March) 8pm
Groups should arrive 15 minutes prior to scheduled departure times. Departure time confirmed on booking.

Capacity: Minimum of 15 and maximum 45 people.



DESERT EXPEDITION

Students will spend the afternoon discovering how the country around them is ancient, alive, exciting and dynamic. Walk with expert guides and meet specialist zookeepers to learn about the plants, animals and people of the Central Australian desert. Finish with a spotlighting tour in a predator proof enclosure at the base of the MacDonnell Ranges.

Inclusions:

- Discovery walk with expert guides to learn about desert plants, animals and people
- Discover threatened and endangered animal species with a Zookeeper
- Exclusive Animal Encounter
- Guided tour of the Nocturnal House
- Reserved seating for Nature Theatre – free flying bird presentation
- Exclusive presentation
- One hour spotlighting Nocturnal Tour

Departure: Available Monday to Friday

Winter (1 April to 30 September) - arrive at 12.30pm to enjoy lunch at the Desert Park (at own expense) for a 1.15pm departure. Concludes at 8pm.

Summer (1 October to 31 March) - arrive at 1pm to enjoy lunch at the Desert Park (at own expense) for a 2pm departure. Concludes at 9pm.

Capacity: Minimum of 15 and maximum 45 people.

Catering: Catering (lunch/dinner) is not included in the tour. There are several facilities to enjoy meal breaks which can be discussed on booking. Alternatively, catering can be arranged at an additional cost.

Sample schedule: Please note this is an example only and will be tailored to each group.

Desert Expedition sample schedule only:

12.30pm	Arrive at the Desert Park. Lunch - picnic ground or Coolamon Café (self-catered)
1.15pm	Meet and Greet by Guide Team. Guided walk.
1.30pm	Meet a Specialist Zookeeper to learn about endangered animals. Includes an Exclusive Animal Encounter
2.15pm	Walk to the Nocturnal House where staff are positioned amongst exhibits to provide short presentations on endangered species
3.30pm	Nature Theatre – reserved seating (winter only)
4.00pm	Exclusive Presentation
4.40pm	Split into groups for desert discovery walk with guides
6.00pm	BBQ Dinner (self-catered)
7.00pm	Nocturnal Tour (winter)
8.00pm	Tour concludes

ADULT TO STUDENT RATIO

One (1) adult per five (5) students is required for children year 9 and below and one (1) adult per ten (10) students is required for year 9 to year 12. Additional adults incur a fee; please refer to the admission fee section.

SUPERVISION

Please remind your students that other people are there for an enjoyable day out and following the basic supervision guidelines will ensure a great day for everybody:

- Students remain the responsibility of the teacher at all times
- It is important that students move through respectfully and consider animals and other members of the public.
- Ensure students understand the needs of the animals and behave accordingly - loud noises and sudden movements can upset the animals
- Ball games and whistles are not permitted.

CANCELLATION POLICY

Cancellation of Discovery Session, Aboriginal Cultural Walk, Nocturnal Tour or the Desert Expedition must be made at least 7 days prior to the visit otherwise a cancellation fee will be invoiced to the school. The cancellation fee will be waived in the event of inclement weather or if the booking is rescheduled to another date.

Cancellation fees are as follows:

6 days' notice 25% of the cost of the service.

2-5 days' notice 50% of the cost of the service.

Less than 24 hours' notice 100% of the cost of the service.
