Alice Springs Desert Park is an inspiring portrayal of Australia's desert environment that effortlessly blends the plants, animals and people of our arid regions.

Essential introduction to Central Australia - with over 200 desert animals and 400 plants to explore at the base of the MacDonnell Ranges. A living field guide to Central Australia.

Dingo Territory - Get up close and meet a dingo. Join a Keeper for the live interactive presentation to discover their history and cultural significance with Aboriginal people.



Share in a living culture - join an Aboriginal Guide at Aboriginal Survival in the Desert and discover how people have lived in Australia's harsh desert environment.

Kangaroos - See Australia's lovable marsupials the Red Kangaroo. Walk amongst these towering animals in woodland.



Spot endangered animals - Step inside one of Australia's largest Nocturnal House and discover rare and endangered species in their sand country and woodland habitats including the bilby, mala and thorny devil.



Deserts are full of life - Explore re-created desert habits, see desert river systems come alive including the amazing story of fish in the desert, abundance of birdlife, enjoy magical winter wildflower display and explore the rich desert woodlands.

Nature Theatre - witness free flying birds demonstrating their natural behaviours in the open air amphitheatre.



Changing Heart Big Screen Movie - Take a cinematic journey through the creation of deserts on the big screen.

Guide Presentations - Share a story and learn from a local at scheduled guide presentations on animals, plants and culture.

Add an Eagle Encounter

Get up close with one of the most impressive sights in the Australian sky, the Wedge-tailed Eagle, Australia's largest bird of prey. With specialist keepers see this magnificent bird at close range with photographs to remember the experience of meeting a raptor. Book on arrival.



Add a Nocturnal Tour

Step inside the Mulga Walk enclosure for an evening of adventure and discovery. Spotlight endangered animals no longer found in the wild including mala and bilby in the foothills of the MacDonnell Ranges. View the Nocturnal Tour Fact Sheet for information.
